

The Search is Gaining Momentum!

My kids love roller coasters...I only do them because my kids would call me “old” if I don’t come along with them. I have been told (but may be wrong) that most roller coasters are powered primarily thru gravity; in other words, they take you way up...slowly...before you crest the highest point and plunge into all the twists and turns that make roller coasters “fun”...but for some of us, slightly nauseous!

Since January, we have been talking about the transition of moving from one Senior Pastor (me) to a new one (yet unknown). The first few months have been like slowly climbing a long hill...

- inform the church family of what is coming, and keep them up to speed
- put together a church profile that describes our church - our strengths, weaknesses, and the things that make our church “unique”
- draft a pastor profile that describes what we are seeking in a Senior Pastor; qualities and characteristics...requirements and “preferences” that will help a new pastor succeed as he shepherds among us
- put together the interview questions, which cover so many aspects of ministry: doctrine, personal calling, family life, ministry background, strengths and weaknesses.

This past week, we “posted the job” with several organizations that will help us get the word out. Within a day, we heard from a couple of people that are interested. That’s very encouraging!

So, what happens next?

1. We post the job and take applications thru late September.
2. Applicants are contacted and sent a packet of information including the formal application, Pastor Profile, Church Profile, website information, a couple of our bulletins, information about the city and neighborhood, and any other materials we think will help them understand our church, city, and the neighborhood we serve.
3. After the application deadline, applications and resumes are reviewed by the elders to determine who we desire to contact for an interview.
4. Interviews will take place in October and November, with the hope that God will lead us to the man who will be our next Senior Pastor.
5. By the end of the year, if all goes well, we may be at the point where the decision has been made.
6. He joins our staff in early 2020, and he works alongside Tim, the pastors and staff, as well as the elders, taking over more and more responsibilities.

We really need all of us to pray!

- Pray that God will prepare our new pastor (and his family) for ministry among us
- Pray for unity among the elders as we seek to glorify God and wait on His leading
- Pray for goodwill among the family here at CPCC, as this transition, with all it’s “moving parts”, can seem wearisome along the way

Where does your story end? How do you continue your story? These are just a few of the questions our high school students were challenged with when we went to CIY this July. We studied over the story of Elijah and his faithfulness to the Lord.

The first three days of the week the students were challenged with questions that made them think about their own life with Jesus and relationship with Him. Questions like, "What do you see worth in? Do you worship an idol?" Just like the worshippers of Baal, you come up empty when you put your trust in things other than God.

One of the other speakers challenged these questions. "Do you find yourself running or hiding from God? Like when Elijah hid in the cave, what caves are you hiding in? Are you hiding in the cave of anger, fear, apathy, loneliness or shame?" A lot of us have caves that we hide in that hinder certain areas of our relationship with Jesus. Maybe you have anger towards God because of hard things in your life. Or maybe because you are shameful about things that you have done, you aren't always honest with God. We were challenged to not only be honest with God and ourselves about those caves but with a friend as well. The amazing thing about God is even when you run and hide just like Elijah, He seeks you out. He sought Elijah out in his cave and He will continue to seek after you even in your own caves.

The last two days encouraged the kids to think about their stories of God working in their own lives. Are we like Elisha in the story of Elijah? Elisha was so excited about what God had been doing with Elijah that he prayed for God to use him twice as much. Elijah even in the beginning didn't think Elisha was serious about following God. So Elijah told Elisha that it would not be easy and that following God would bring hard times. Elisha wasn't playing games though, he was SERIOUS about whole heartily following God. So serious that he even went back home and burned EVERYTHING he had. So think about it...are you as serious about following God as Elisha was? He gave up everything to prove his faithfulness. Does your Jesus matter NOW? If so, our story of God working CAN NOT end with you. How will your story be continued?



Runner's High

I love to run. I love to put my headphones on and just hit the road or the trails. I get time to pray, think, listen to music and just enjoy being outside. I have come up with ideas for songs while running, I (as you will soon read) have gotten inspiration for my newsletter articles, and most importantly-God has really spoken to me multiple times during runs. It's one strategy I use to get some quiet time to meditate and focus on Him.

The problem is, while I love to run, my body-more and more each year-doesn't quite share my fondness and enthusiasm for it. My muscles hurt, my joints (especially my knees) ache, and as I get older, I find it harder and harder to lose weight and keep it off. Carrying 190lbs around for three to five miles on bad knees isn't quite as easy as carrying 175lbs on healthy legs used to be. On top of that, I struggle with injuries from time to time. I seem to have a chronic pulled muscle in my calf that rears its ugly head at least once a year, and most recently I had a pretty nasty ankle sprain while running a trail race up in Iowa.

This week, I came back to running after taking a few weeks off to heal that ankle injury. If you've ever been a runner, you know that coming back after resting an injury can be challenging. You've lost your edge, you've lost time, you're sluggish and sore. It isn't very fun but if you really care about running, either for fitness or for mental well-being, or for both, you get back out there and fight through it anyway, as hard as it may seem.

As I ran this morning, I was just about to hit my four-mile goal and call it quits and Jars of Clay's version of "I'll Fly Away" popped up on my playlist. It's a great, slow, bluegrassy version of the classic hymn and if you've never heard it, you should check it out, but that's not what this article is about. As I finished my run listening to that song, with its message of looking forward to the end of our struggles on Earth and an eternity in Heaven, made me think of how life is a lot like running.

Our life on earth is hard, sometimes we're doing fine and cruising along making good time. We're blessed and everything is going our way. But then sometimes we suffer injuries; setbacks, disappointments, heartaches, and tragedies. When these happen, it can be hard to get back out there and can take a lot of work to get back to the level you had just been at. Plus, as we get older and the struggles of life increase while our bodies start to break down, it can be hard to see the finish line.

Have faith though, God has promised us more than what this world has to offer. At the end of my run, even the hard, long, hot rehab runs, I always feel good. Some people call it a runner's high. Most of it has to do with the bodies release of endorphins and other chemicals to help it cope with the perceived strain that exercise puts on it. It's also a sense of accomplishment and just plain happiness to be done with another workout. As Christians, we are also promised a "runner's high" at the end of our earthly workout, an eternity with God.

MISSION SPOTLIGHT - The Medlen's, Senegal, West Africa



Our family, (Aaron, Andrea, Elijah (10), Azariah (almost 8), Lizabelle (almost 4), & Noelle (1), has been living in and out of Senegal, West Africa since 2009.

Our purpose is to facilitate church planting movements by raising disciples to make disciple makers through multiplication. We are targeting the Mandinka people,

who remain majority Muslim and have very little missionary activity among them (Unreached People Group). The environment we work in is extremely difficult as Senegal is an under-developed country and lies just south of the Sahara desert. Currently we are developing our language skills in French and Mandinka as we prepare to recruit teammates for our team. My wife also has her hands full homeschooling our children in addition to keeping me out of trouble!

Another vision we desire is to impact the complexities of poverty. By increasing understanding of this culture and its worldview, we are progressing our abilities to share the Gospel and discovering ways to actually help build up communities. Additionally, we attain our Visa by engaging in a local, faith-based well-digging association which can provide clean water solutions and sanitary latrines. We completely rely on individuals and churches in the US to partner with us financially and prayerfully.

We have discovered that WhatsApp is a great way to stay in touch with us. This free app allows us to message each other just like a text message from your smartphone. Additionally this app lets us send texts, photos, voice recordings, even short videos directly from our phones to yours! We envision sharing quick messages about once or twice a week. It's encrypted, so the content is secure. Your number won't be shared with anyone else in the group; but, you can respond to our message to have one-on-one conversations at any time! (We'd love to see pics of your kids, hear how we can pray for you, what you're doing to reach out and impact your community.) This would bless and encourage us also.

To start getting updates--and to be able to be in touch with us 'in real time':

1. Download WhatsApp on your phone
2. Create a Contact for Aaron Medlen (+221 country code, then 771000142)
3. Send us a hello via WhatsApp, mention your name, and we'll enter you in our contacts. It's that simple! Soon you'll be getting little updates and be able to stay in touch in real time! (please do not share or post any updates publicly)

The Arabian Peninsula

Two Muslim Women Choose Christ



Two women in the Arabian Peninsula have turned from Islam and have committed their lives to Christ, a decision that in the Middle East could cost them opportunities for marriage and a family. The two women live at home with their Muslim parents, who know of their daughters' new faith and are not happy about it. Their parents tolerate their faith, however, because they love their daughters and want them

to stay at home. They have not told anyone about their daughter's conversion to Christianity, fearing extended family members might try to kill them if their conversions became known. Still, the parents try to reconvert the women to Islam at every opportunity, sharing Quranic verses and trying to debate religion with them.

Although women are expected to marry in Muslim culture, these new Christians refuse to compromise and marry a Muslim. With so few Christians in the county, the women do not expect to ever marry. "Their faith is very impressive," said VOM's regional director for the Middle East. "Because of their faith, they have no options for marriage."

On a recent visit to the region, VOM workers were encouraged to find more Christians in the country than expected, and the two women now attend church with other believers. Despite the sacrifice these women have made, they say the reward of heaven is reason enough to follow Jesus.

Photography as a Ministry?

This spring I was tired and stressed. I knew I wanted to be in full time missions, but I didn't know what that would look like. When I went to God with my request He told me to wait and continue to seek Him. A couple of weeks later my Dad asked if I had thought of doing photography as a ministry. He said that God had given me a gift in photography. He knew that joy would come through giving glory to God and in building His

kingdom. That night I found my mom waiting to ask, "Have you considered doing something that brings you joy as a ministry?" Over the next few weeks people persisted in asking, "Have you ever considered doing photography long term?" My prayers became one question, "Is photography the ministry I am meant to be in?"

God spoke through an advertisement, "Have you considered photography as a ministry?" Peace overwhelmed my heart as I filled out the short application. That night I received a call. Youth With A Mission (YWAM) wanted me to continue the application process. July 5th I received the call informing me that I had been chosen and would soon be enrolled in YWAM's Arts Evangelists School. As of October 2019 I am supposed to be in Newcastle Australia. Over the course of six months I will be trained and sent out with the intent to use photography to spread God's Word and bring glory to His name. I am looking forward to growing with those around me as we learn, serve, and worship in community.

I am in need of prayer and financial support. Whether it is mowing lawns or babysitting, I will do whatever it takes to follow His will. My request of you is that you consider coming alongside me. I currently have \$400 and am working towards a goal of \$9,700. This will cover transportation, three months of YWAM training, and a three month long mission trip through YWAM after training.


