Righteousness...<u>being right with God</u>...is a priority in Jesus' teaching and ministry (5: 6 and 10)

Jesus dealt with the Pharisees a lot during his ministry...what did He think of them? (Matthew 23)

If God isn't looking for external righteousness...if that doesn't cut it... what will?
