### A Child Like Faith with a PK Heart

Ephesians 6:1-4

<sup>1</sup>Children, obey your parents in the Lord, for this is right. <sup>2</sup> "Honor your father and mother" which is the first commandment with a promise <sup>3</sup> "so that it may go well with you and that you may enjoy long life on the earth." Fathers, do not exasperate your children; instead, bring them up in the training and instruction of the Lord.

I have been taking the last couple of months letting you in on a little bit of who the Slack family is. While I have not gone into deep and intimate details of our family, I have given you a bit of the dynamic of what it is to be a pastor, pastor's wife, and now today, the PK (Preacher's kid).

One, do not place unrealistic expectations on any PK. Many place a halo over the head of the PK and expect it to not bend. "All have sinned and come short of the glory of God." (This includes the PK.) How often has a phrase like this been said, "Can you believe what the PK did?". I've never heard anyone say, "Did you hear what the electrician's kid did?". Two, don't take for granted the sacrifice it is to be a PK. Most do not see the extra time that is put in at the church for the PK. They put in a lot of hours alongside the preaching dad. It is an unseen labor that cannot be overlooked. You all have already done a phenomenal job of pouring into him and we thank you greatly for that! You have made him feel welcomed, loved, and included. It's who you are.

Lastly, pray for every PK you know. The stats are astounding of how many PK's leave the church because they did not like the pressures and saw things behind the scenes that they did not like. In visiting with Tim, he expressed that this was not the case for his kids. He said you all did a fantastic job investing in the lives of his children and they noticed it. That's who you are.

Thanks for being who you are. Thanks for loving the PK the way you have and will continue to do. Thanks for allowing my PK to develop into what God is calling him to be and continue to be the awesome body of Christ that makes this church so special. That's who we all are.

## OUR WORSHIP LEADER



### What does worship look like?

What does worship look like? What should worship look like? Is it somber and reverent or is it loud and enthusiastic? Is it bowed heads, silent reflection and folded hands or is it raised palms, shouts of amen and hallelujah and stomping feet? Well, the answer is... pretty much, all of that.

In scripture there are countless descriptions of what worship can and should look like, and they don't always go together. There is shouting (Psalm 5:11; 32:11; 35:27; 132:9; Hebrews 5:7), there is reverent bowing (Psalm 95:6; Philippians 2:10; I Corinthians 14:25), there is clapping (Psalm 47:1-2), there is silence in reflection and learning (Acts 11:18; Habakkuk 2:20), there is the raising of hands (Psalm 134:2) and there is, of course, worship through prayer (Philippians 4:6). A funny thing to note here is in the praying with folded hands.

This is a common practice when we pray, yet not one supported by scripture. Folding hands to pray is a Christian tradition thought to have come out of a practice of shutting out the world to focus on God, but it isn't ever mentioned or instructed in scripture. The Bible specifically mentions praying while standing, kneeling, sitting and it talks about the raising or opening the arms and hands (which is a sign of receiving God's blessing), but it never tells us to fold our hands.

What's important here, in all of these things, is not so much about posture, styles or even how often we do these things. What I would like us to explore is our intent with what we are doing. What is behind the heart of our praise?

John 4:24 tells us that the Lord desires us to worship Him "in spirit and in truth." We, as humans and children of God, were created by God to worship and glorify Him, period. Let me say that again in a slightly different way, the ONLY REASON we exist is to praise our Heavenly Father. Therefore, this is what we should be doing. This is our calling. Matthew 6 warns against using prayer and worship to glorify ourselves, so we must go before Him in humility and pure reverence. Now, in researching scripture for this article, I found multiple descriptions of loud and enthusiastic worship, and while quite less, even some of quiet worship. So, is there a right way? Here is what does seem clear, when we worship, however we worship, we are to focus on Him and Him alone. If we are making a spectacle of our worship to draw attention to ourselves, that isn't worship, that's our flesh seeking recognition. But we must also be careful not to be too distracted by how someone else is worshiping. When we are unbalanced in either area, we are putting our focus on the wrong thing and not the King of kings.

We are blessed to be part of a church body that is as diverse as the scriptures I mentioned above. While we continue to grow and stretch as a church body, we should be respectful of someone who doesn't worship exactly the same way we might. Whether you're more reserved or more animated, be considerate of one another. Consider your Father in Heaven first, though. It's not about what or who is right, it's always about WHO it is to. We're all praying to the same God, and He speaks to us in different ways just as we pour out to Him in different ways. The most important thing here is to make sure it is OF Him and FOR Him before we offer it TO Him.

As your worship leader, I think I am pretty widespread across the spectrum. Any of you who have been in service and worshiped with me know that I value hitting your knees and offering your body as a prostrate sacrifice in humility to God as much as I do putting your hands together and being so moved by the Spirit that the pews can't confine you. I celebrate both enthusiastic and humble, reverent worship. Will you join me in asking God to continue to direct our worship? Ask Him to help us remained focused on Him. Ask Him for peace and wisdom and the ability to respect someone that may not worship exactly like you do. Then, on Sunday, show up with a full heart, ready to pour out that perfect, spotless offering to the Lord. Do it loud or do it soft, it doesn't matter, just do it for Him.

### Sabbath Rest

I have come to realize the importance of sabbath rest. I don't know if you are anything like me, but I sure do lack making rest with the Lord a priority in my life. The first two years of full time ministry here at CPCC, I was so crazy busy I only rested with the Lord a total of four days. That's right, four days over two years! Let me tell you, that was one of the worse decisions of my life.

I found myself easily angered and frustrated with those around me. Anything that I could not control would stress me out and give me anxiety. I had lost my joy in the Lord and in ministering to the youth. I found I was exhausted after getting adequate sleep at night. I was battling thoughts almost everyday that told me I had no purpose. I was starting to believe those were true. Looking back, I have come to realize, I was burnt out and had allowed satan to tell me lie, after lie, after lie. Those lies put me in a complete state of depression and anxiety.

But God, just like Ephesians 2:4 says, "who is rich in mercy and love for me, saved me from that constant state of being." He sent many great women and mentors who almost always asked me the same question... "Are you resting in the Lord?" Obviously the answer was no. It took many hints from God to get my attention and for me to finally realize that I needed to take time to rest with Him.

So why does Sabbath rest need to be a priority in our lives? The sabbath helps us to remember and practice some very important things in our lives. When we decide to take time out of our week, even if that means not getting everything done, we are surrendering to God. We are surrendering the fact that we are ultimately NOT the creator and sustainer of our lives - God is. Sabbath can also be thought of as an act of trusting God. To practice the sabbath is a disciplined and faithful way to remember, we are NOT the ones who keep the world running.

Being intentional about resting with the Lord is not only a declaration to those around us, but also to our own thoughts and hearts, that God is the one who sustains us. God should be the one in which we find our joy, peace, comfort and rest. He is the one who provides us with strength in every situation. If we are neglecting personal time with Him, we are not being refilled and that's when we leave ourselves wide open for satan to take a hit at us.


